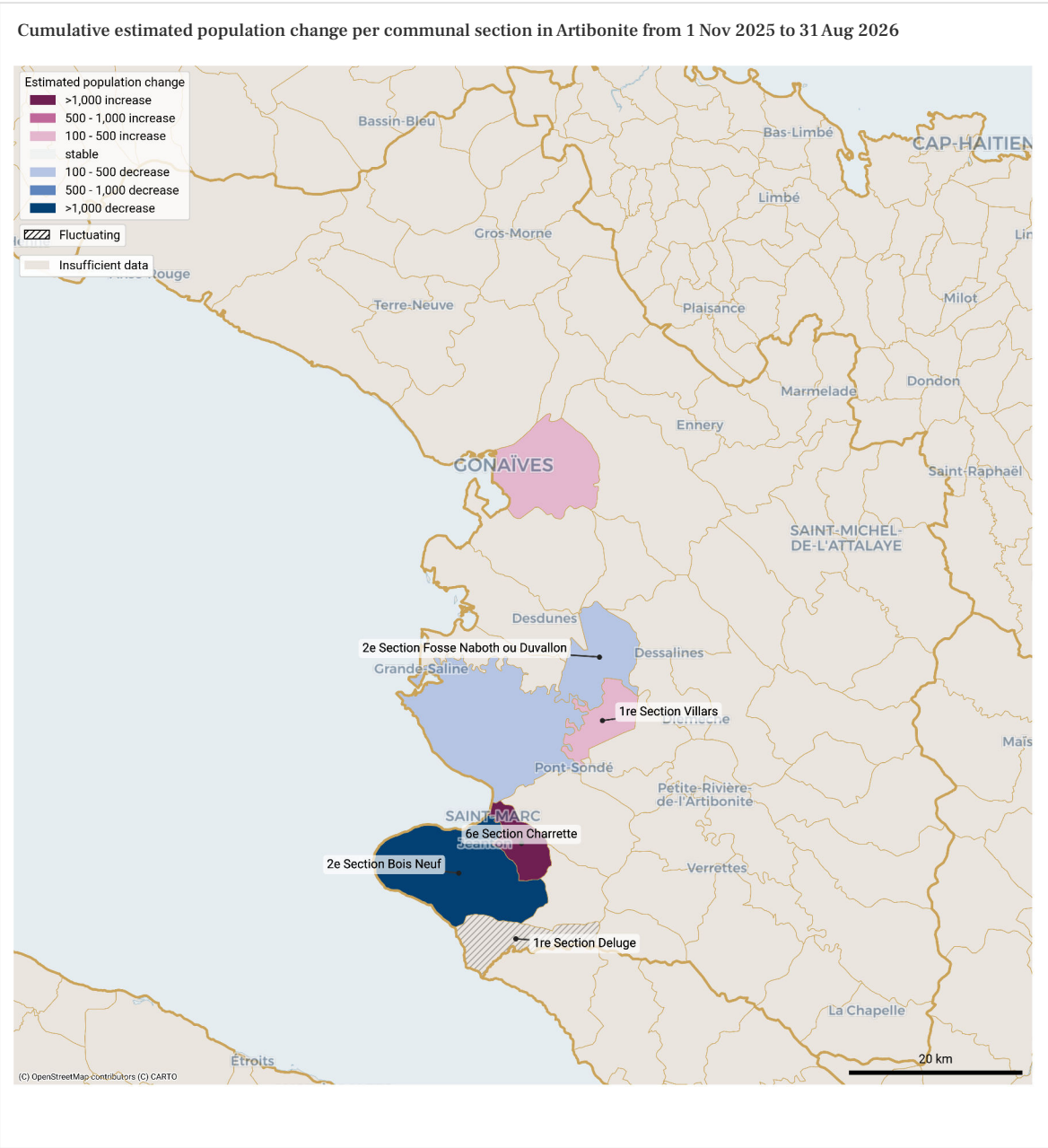
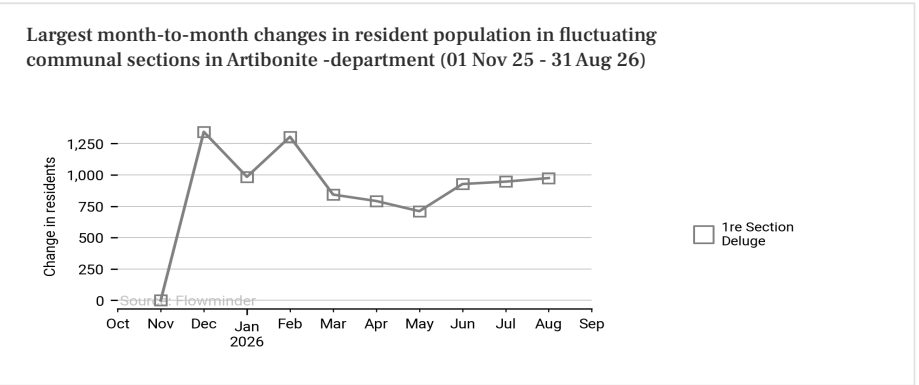
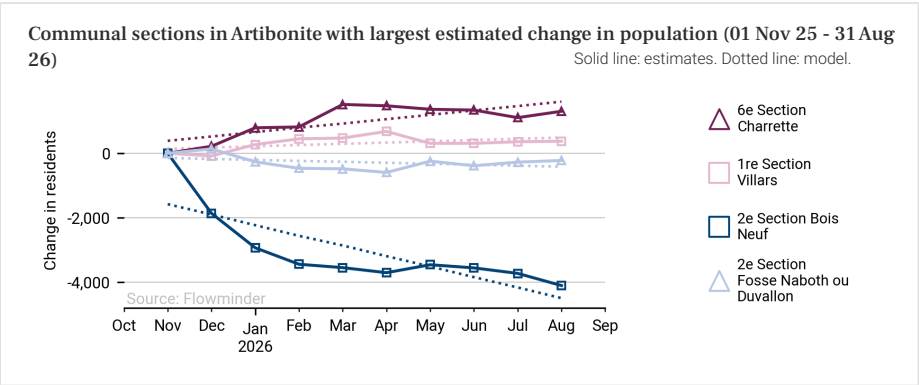
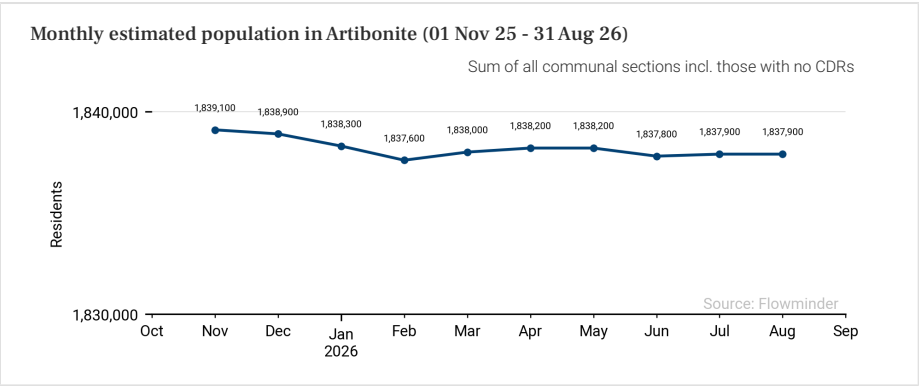
Key observations for the period 01 Nov 25 - 31 Aug 26

- **NOTE:** In the Southern Region, service availability remained reduced in early August 2026 after fiber optic damage, with service recovering mid-month; estimates for Grande-Anse, Nippes, South and South-East are based on a smaller sample during this period.
- **NOTE:** Due to partial and low population coverage of the data used, the estimates shown in this report may contain biases. Particularly for the departments Artibonite, Centre and North-East and North-West, data is available only for a small number of sections.
- In the Port-au-Prince Metropolitan Area (ZMPAP), 2e Section Morne l'Hôpital remains the largest increase nationally (+11,210) but levelled off since July, while 1re Section St Martin (Delmas) rose to +3,610. 1re Section Turgeau remains the largest decrease (-9,640), stable since June.
- In contrast, 5e Section Bellevue Chardonniere (Pétion-Ville) is now +1,440, down from +2,440 in the [July report](#), reversing several months of increase, while 10e Section Thor (Carrefour) declined further (-2,590).
- Outside ZMPAP in West, 3e Section Sourcailles (Kenscoff) remains the largest decrease (-2,200), the monthly estimates having fallen between June and July, coinciding with armed attacks in Kenscoff on 4-8 July that displaced 5,840 people, 36% of them to Pétion-Ville ([ETT100.1](#)).
- In Artibonite, 2e Section Bois Neuf (Saint-Marc) declined further to -4,110, the third largest decrease nationally; IOM DTM recorded around 11,000 people displaced in the department between 6 and 28 July ([ETT101.2](#), [ETT102](#), [ETT103](#)), largely from sections with little or no data coverage.

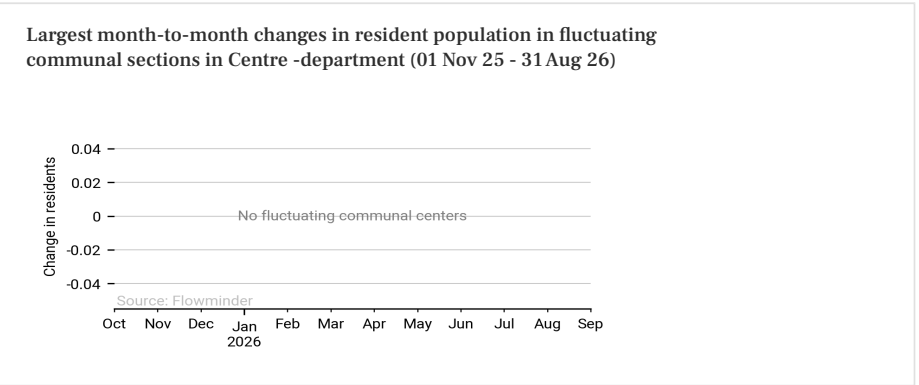
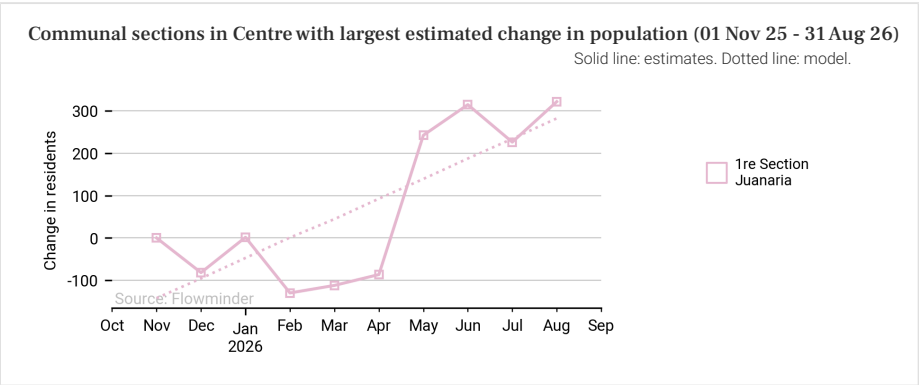
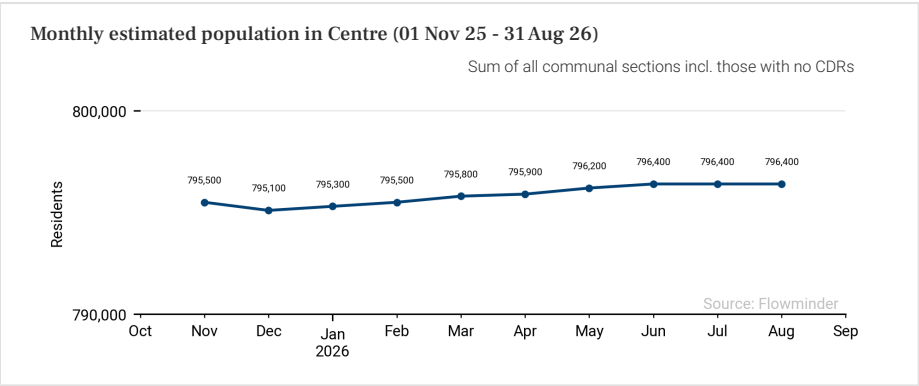
Cumulative estimated population change by departments and communal sections between 1 Nov 2025 and 31 Aug 2026



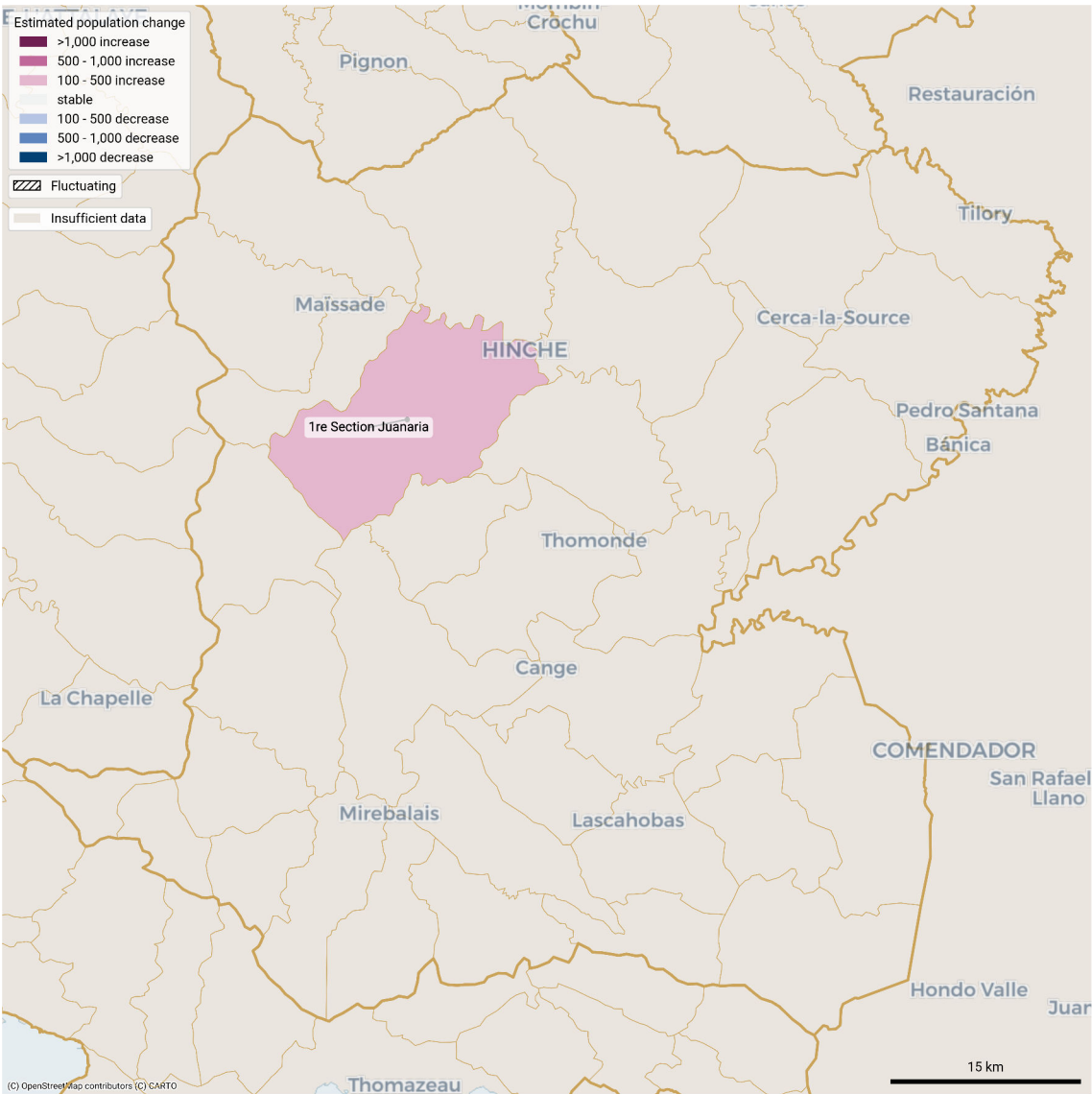

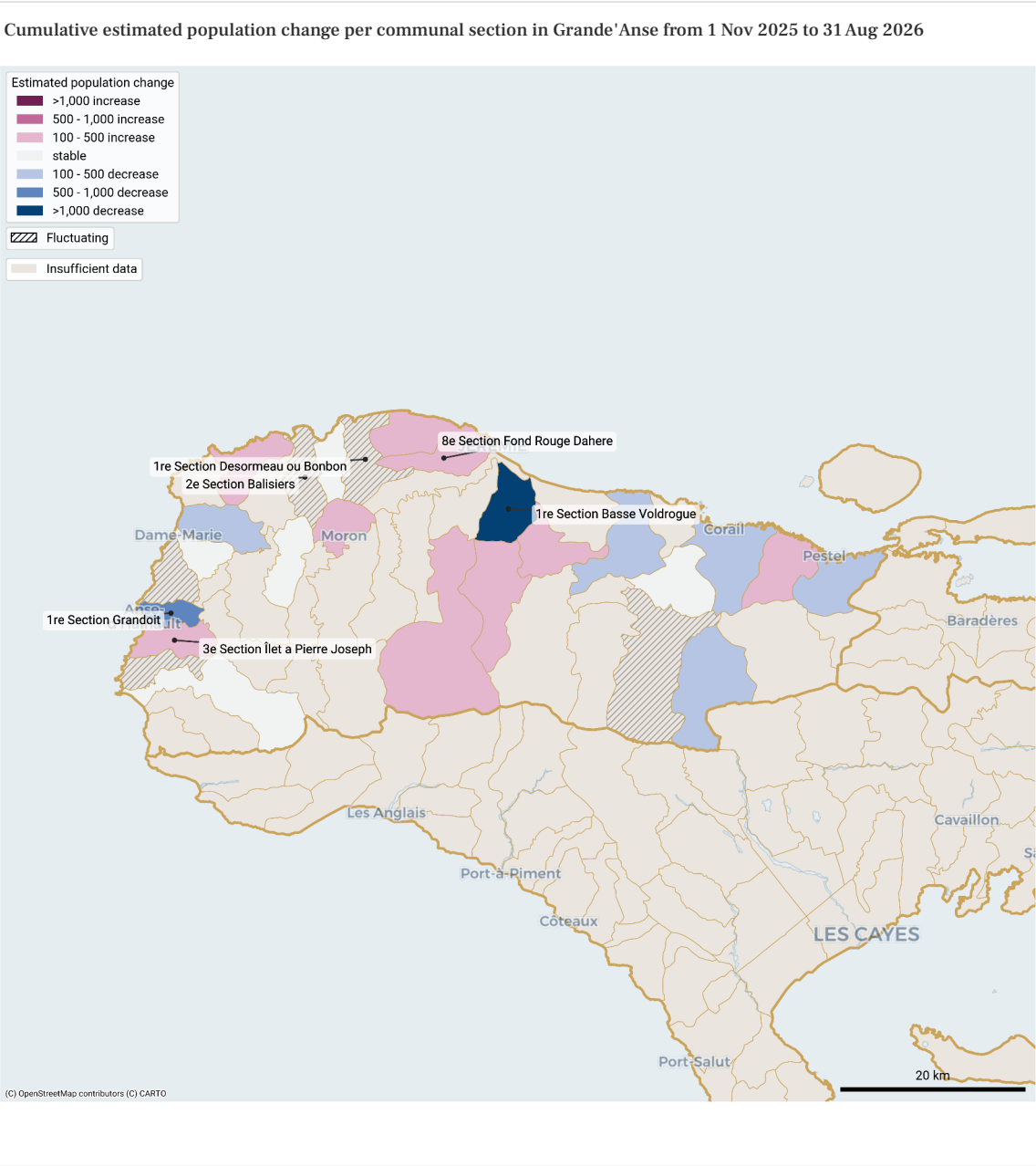
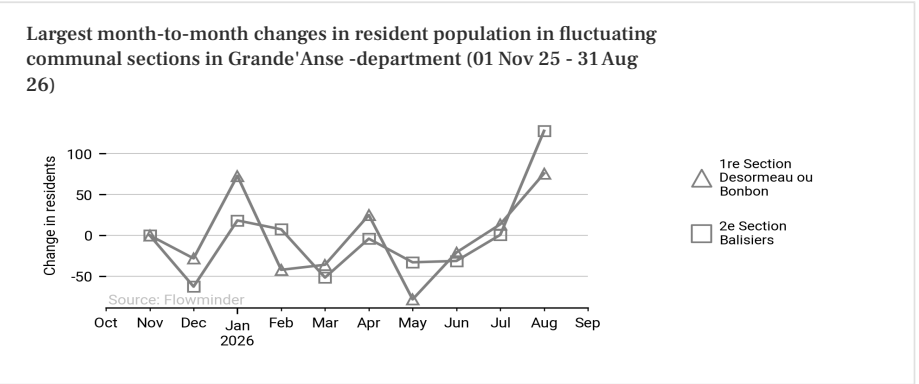
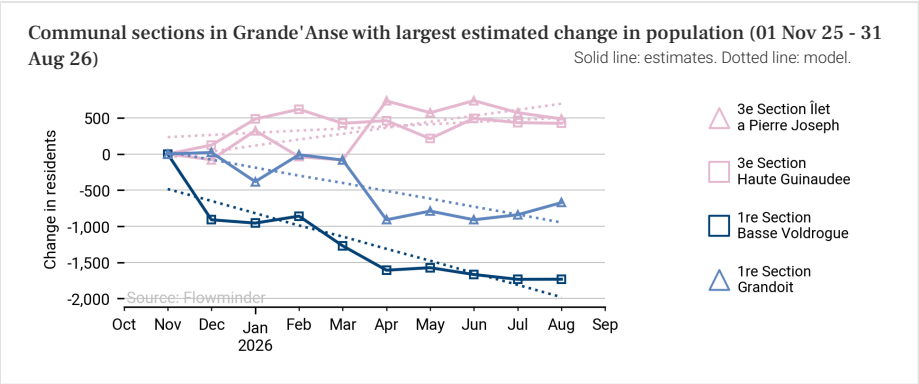
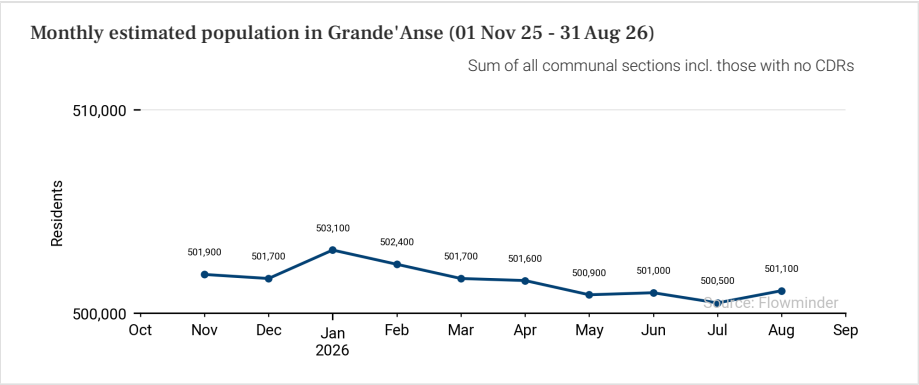
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Cumulative estimated population change per communal section in Centre from 1 Nov 2025 to 31 Aug 2026



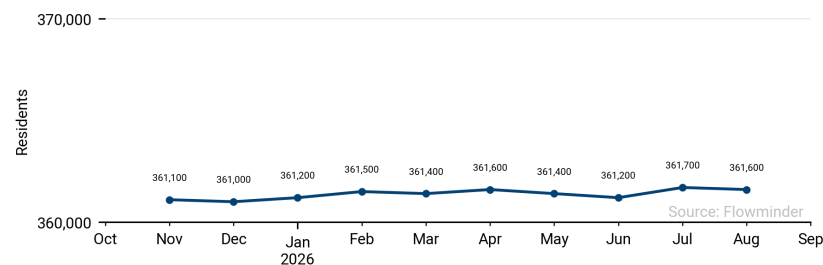
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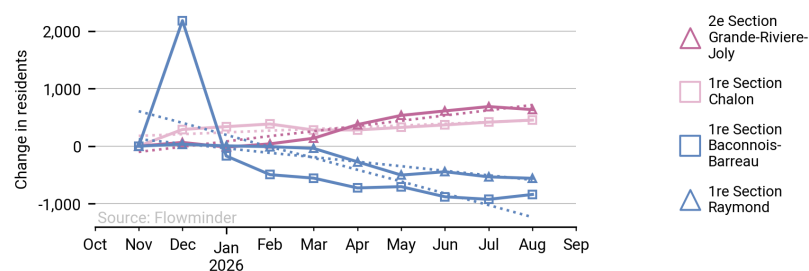
Monthly estimated population in Nippes (01 Nov 25 - 31 Aug 26)

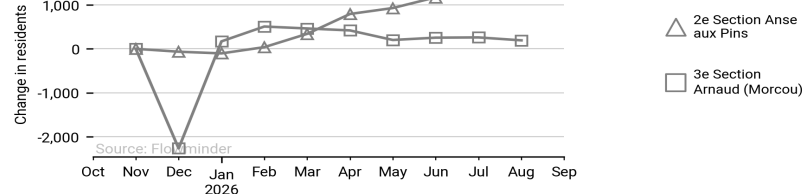


Communal sections in Nippes with largest estimated change in population (01 Nov 25 - 31 Aug 26)

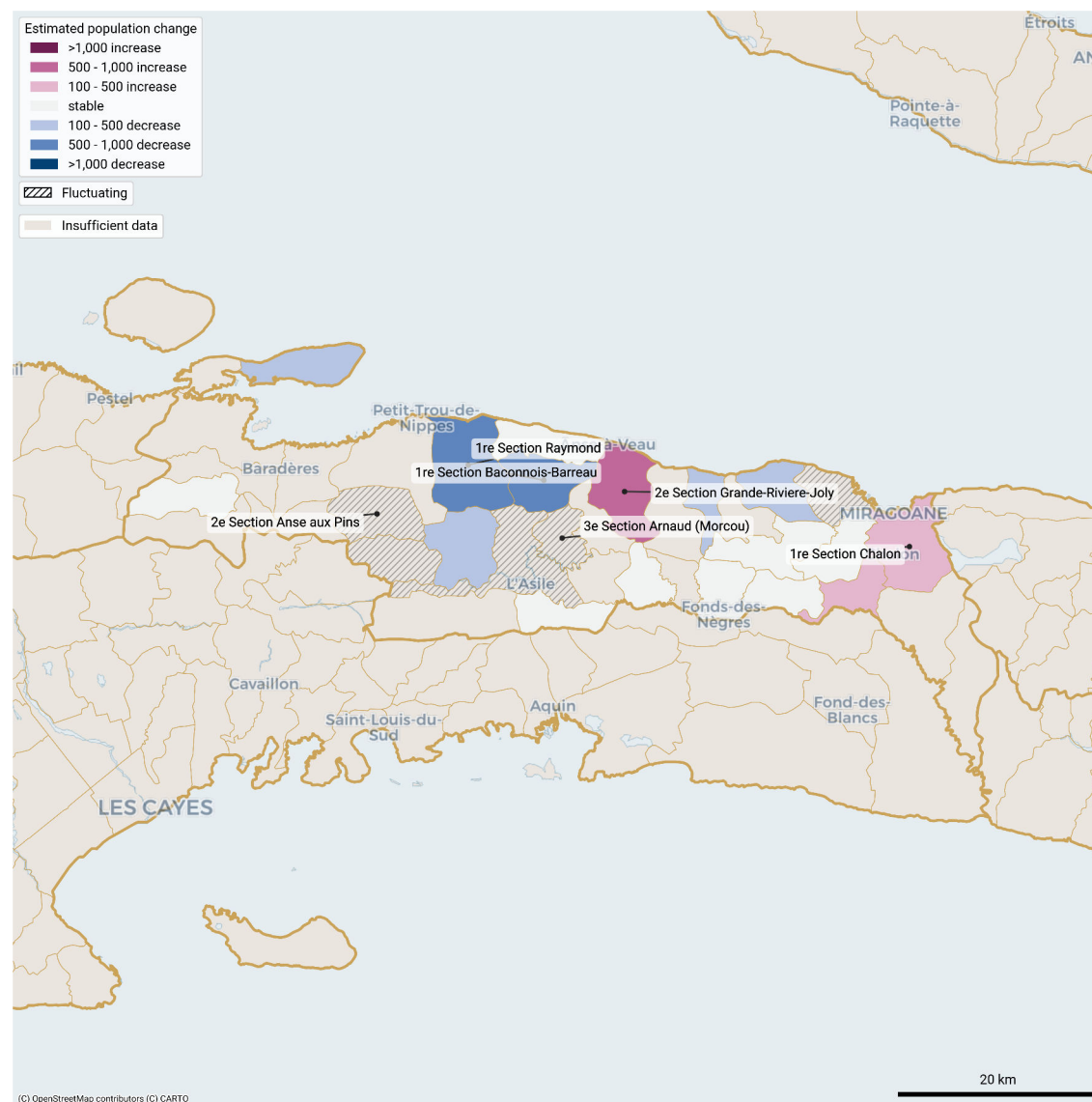

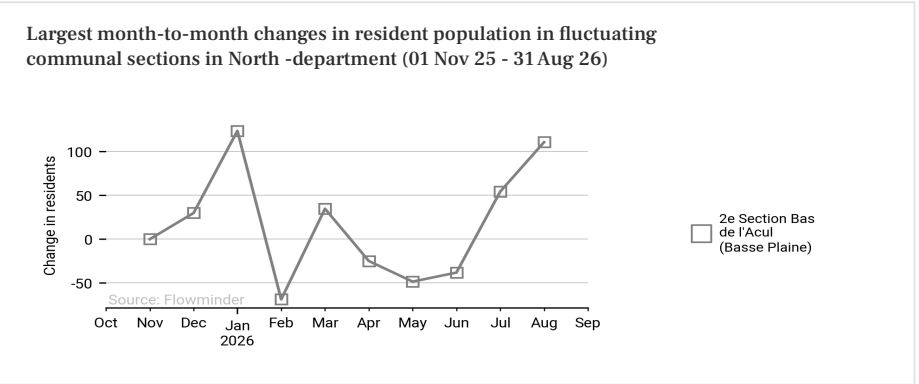
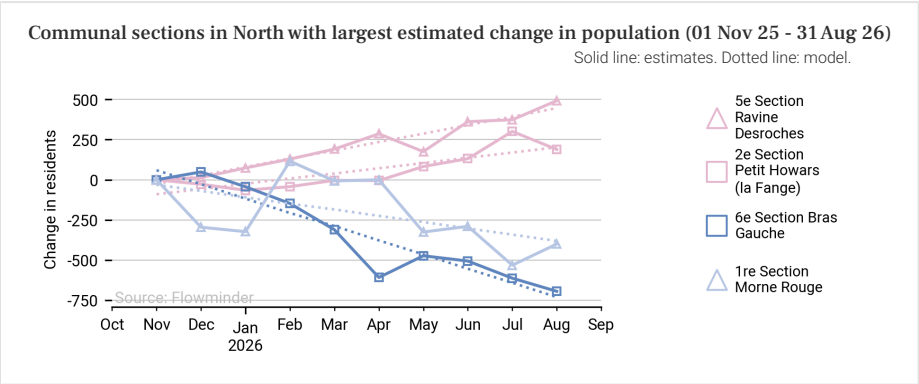
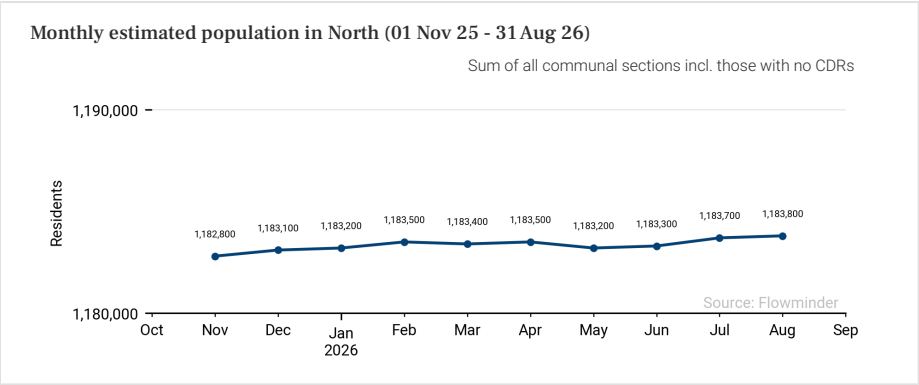


Largest month-to-month changes in resident population in fluctuating communal sections in Nippes -department (01 Nov 25 - 31 Aug 26)

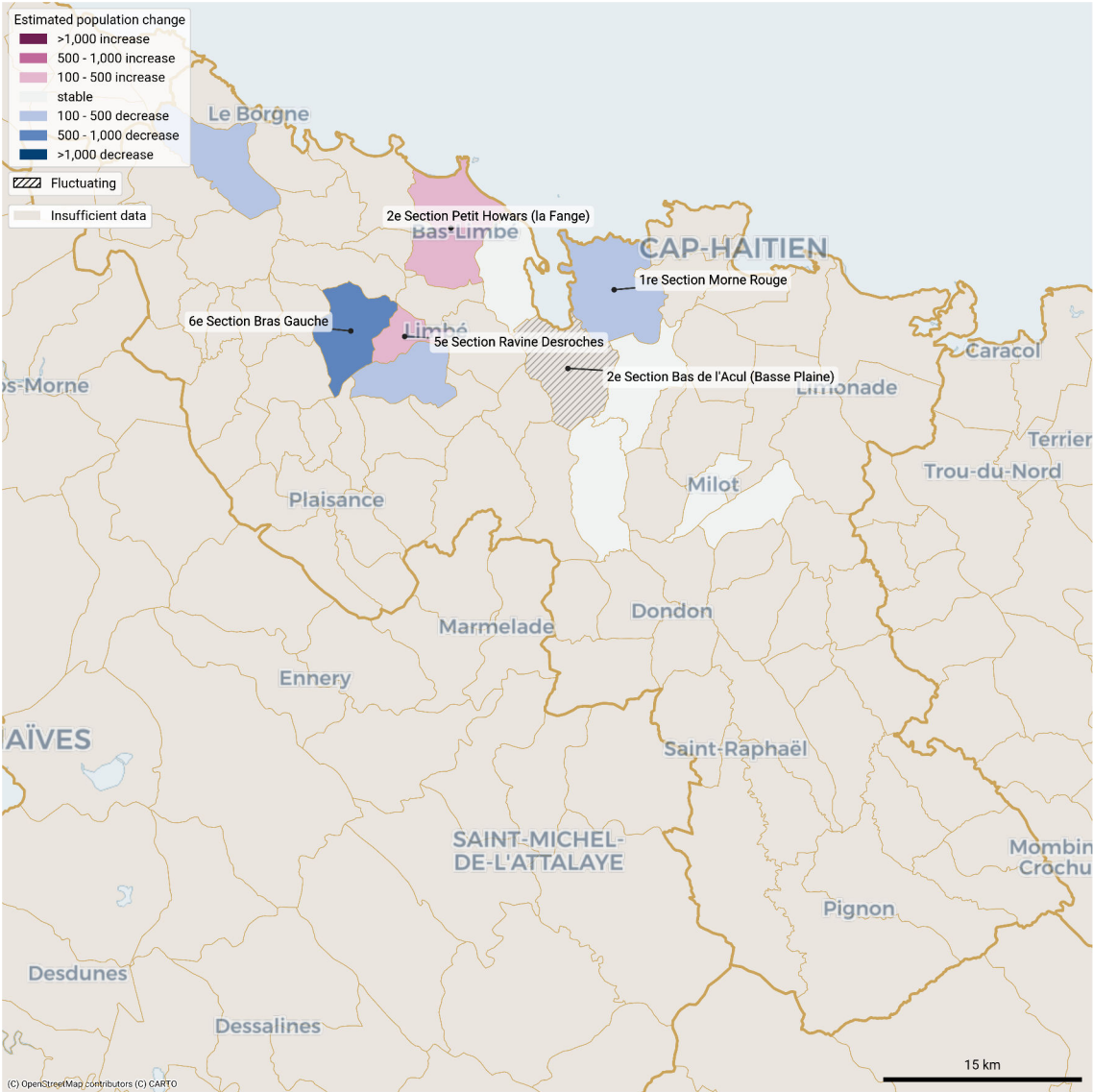


Cumulative estimated population change per communal section in Nippes from 1 Nov 2025 to 31 Aug 2026

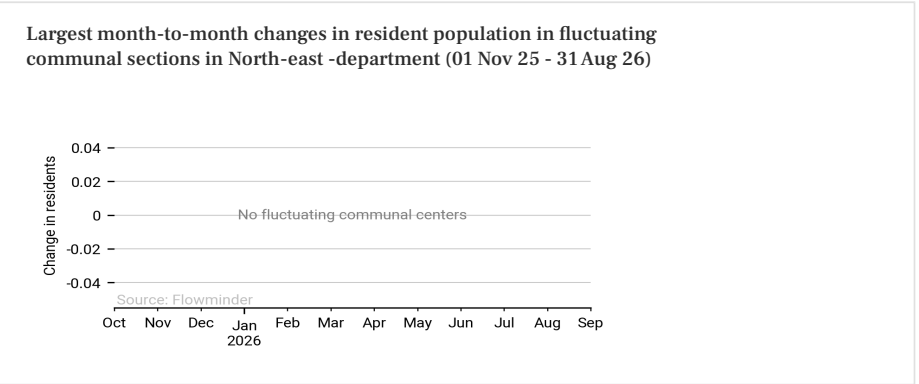
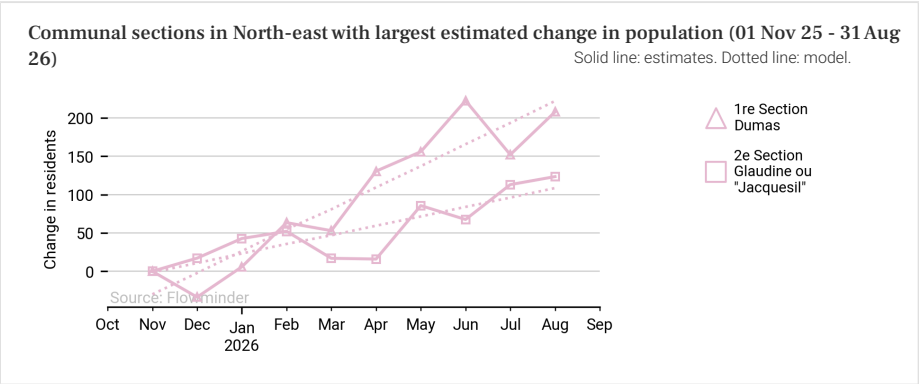
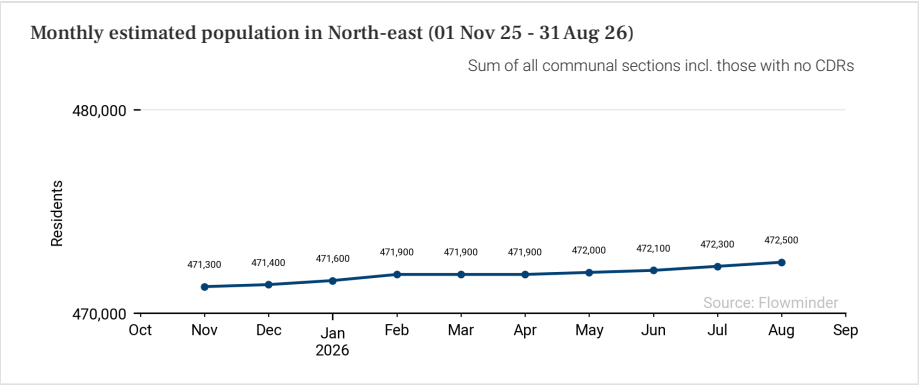




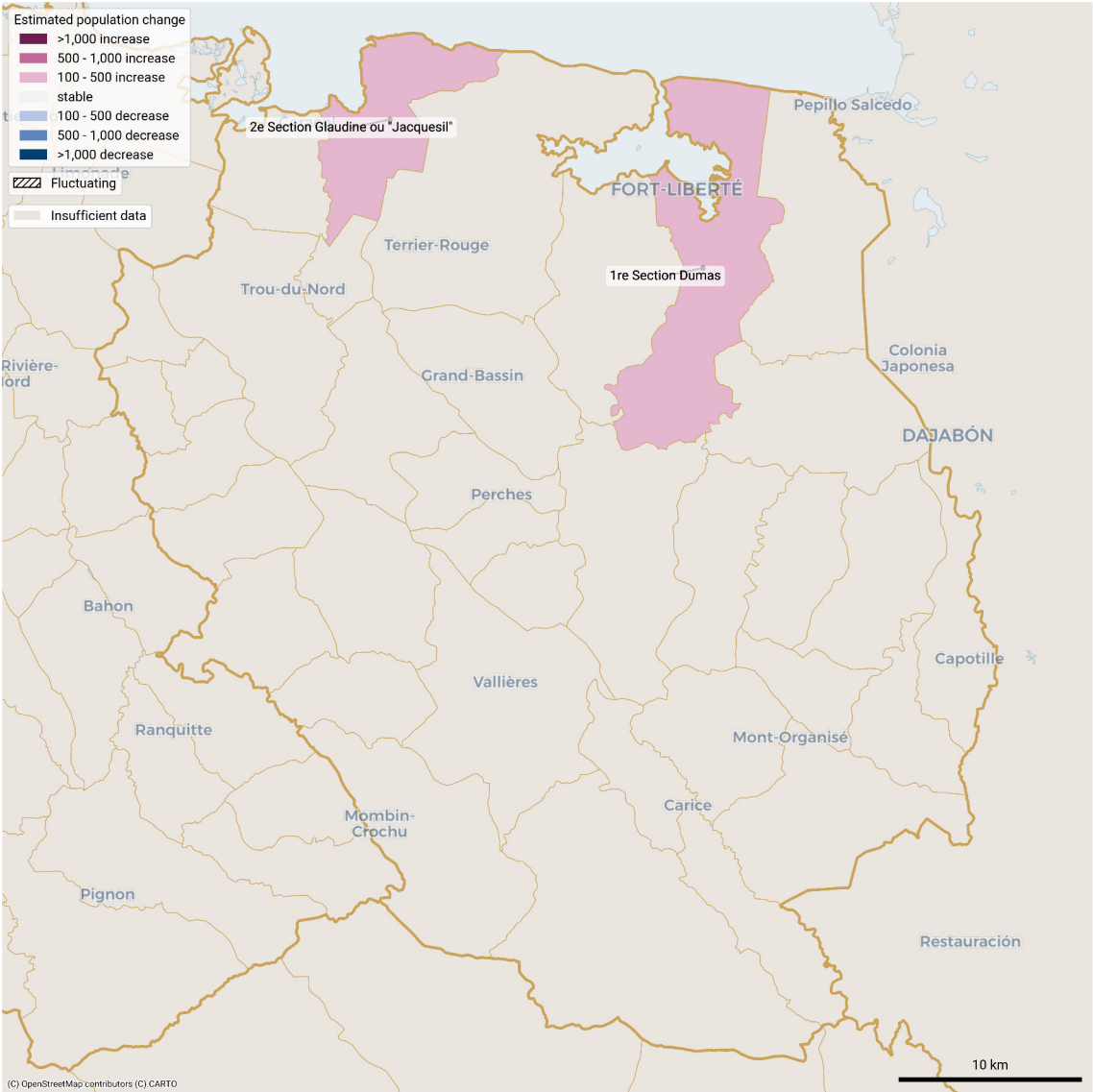
Cumulative estimated population change per communal section in North from 1 Nov 2025 to 31 Aug 2026



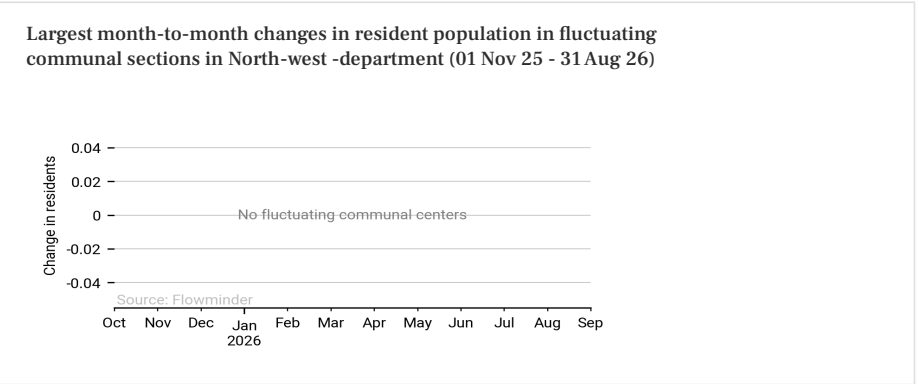
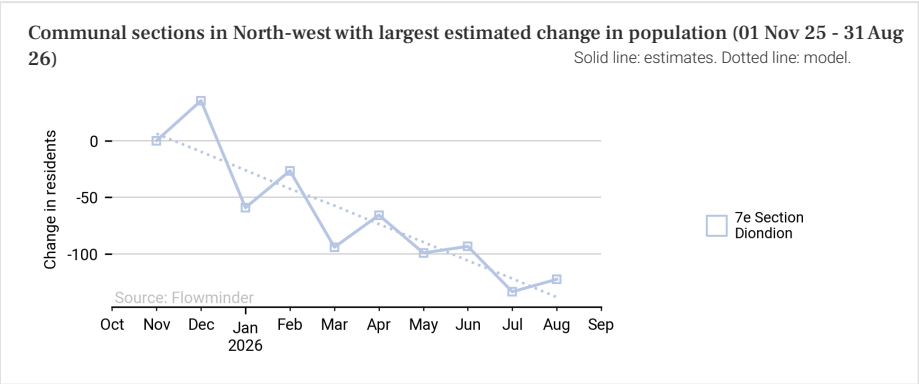
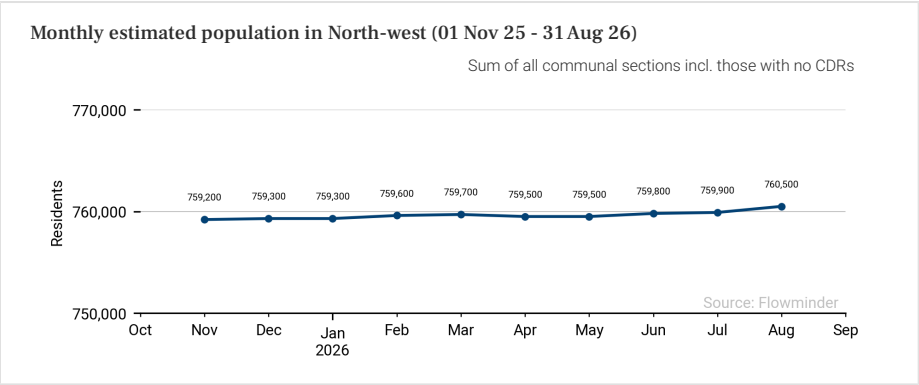
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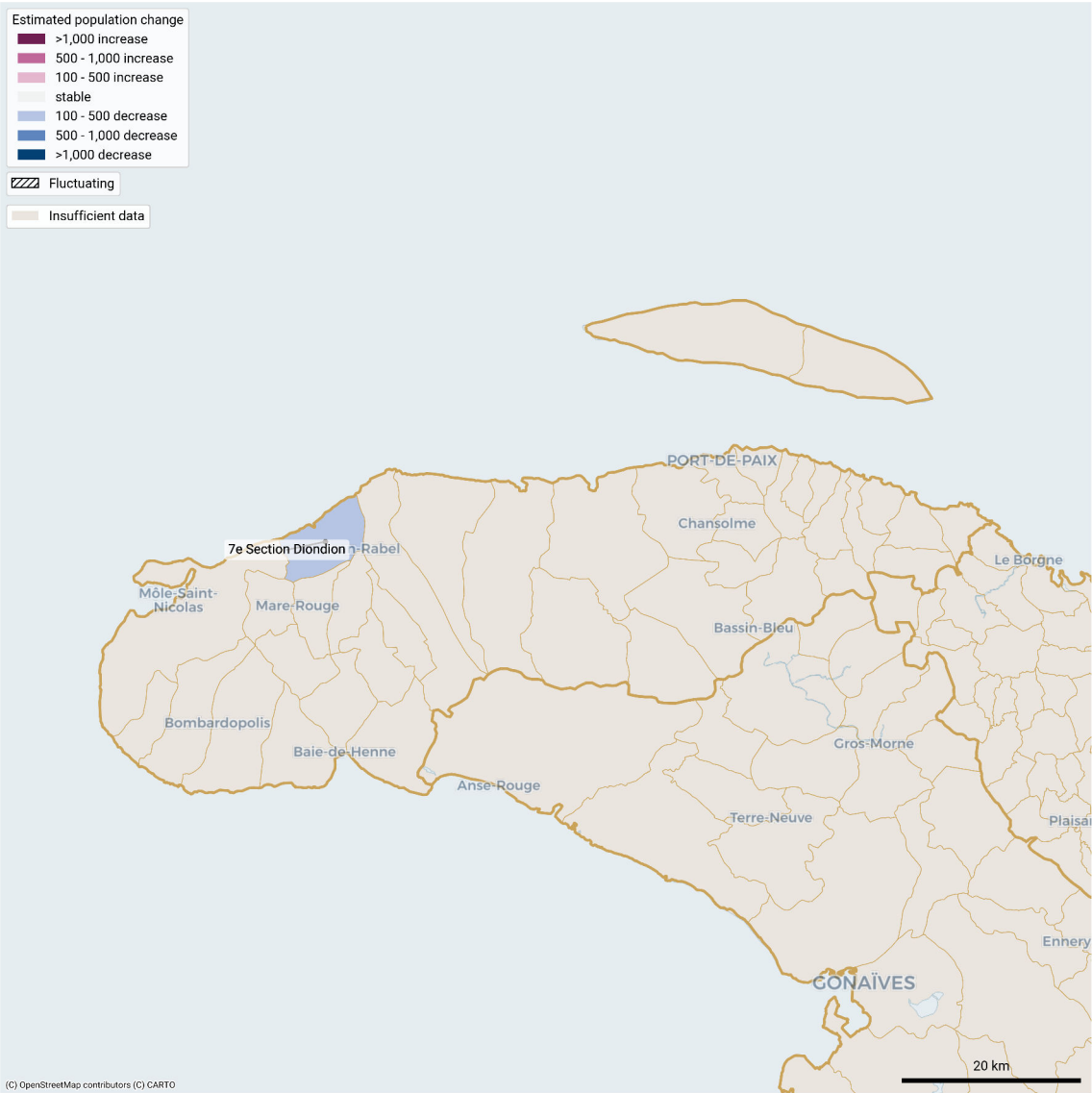
Cumulative estimated population change per communal section in North-east from 1 Nov 2025 to 31 Aug 2026



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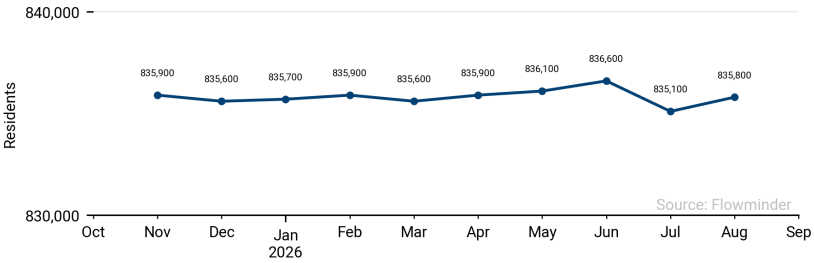
Cumulative estimated population change per communal section in North-west from 1 Nov 2025 to 31 Aug 2026



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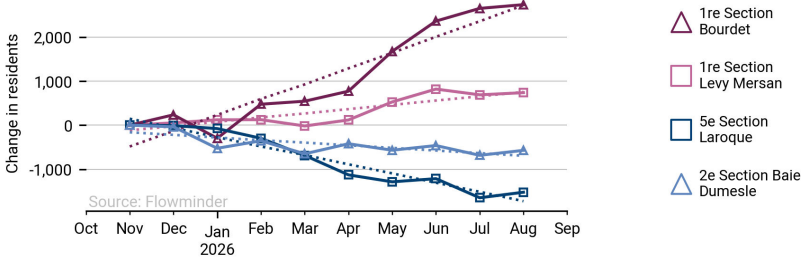
Monthly estimated population in South (01 Nov 25 - 31 Aug 26)

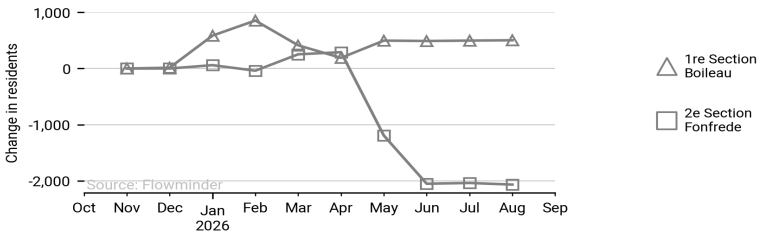


Communal sections in South with largest estimated change in population (01 Nov 25 - 31 Aug 26)

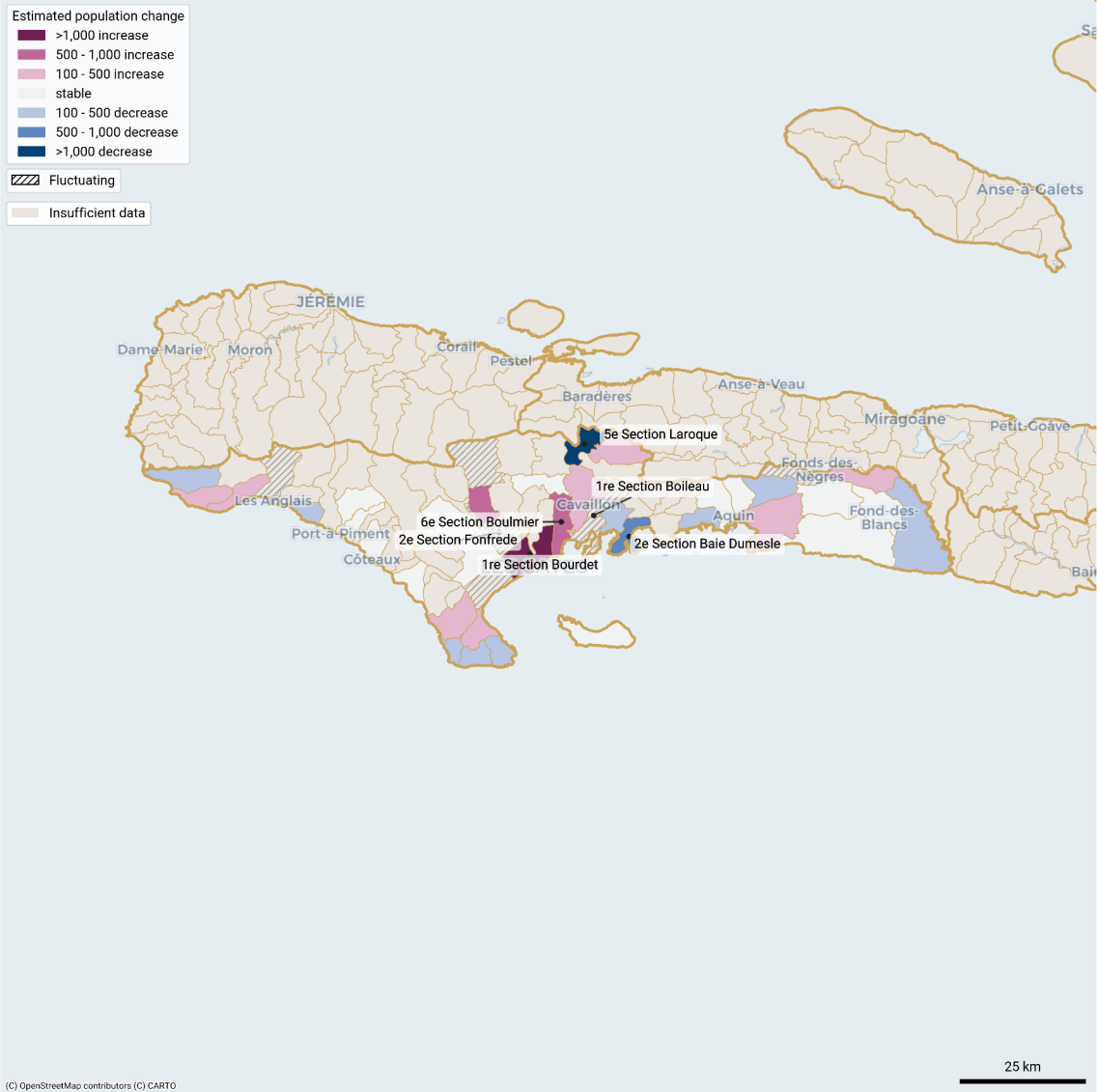

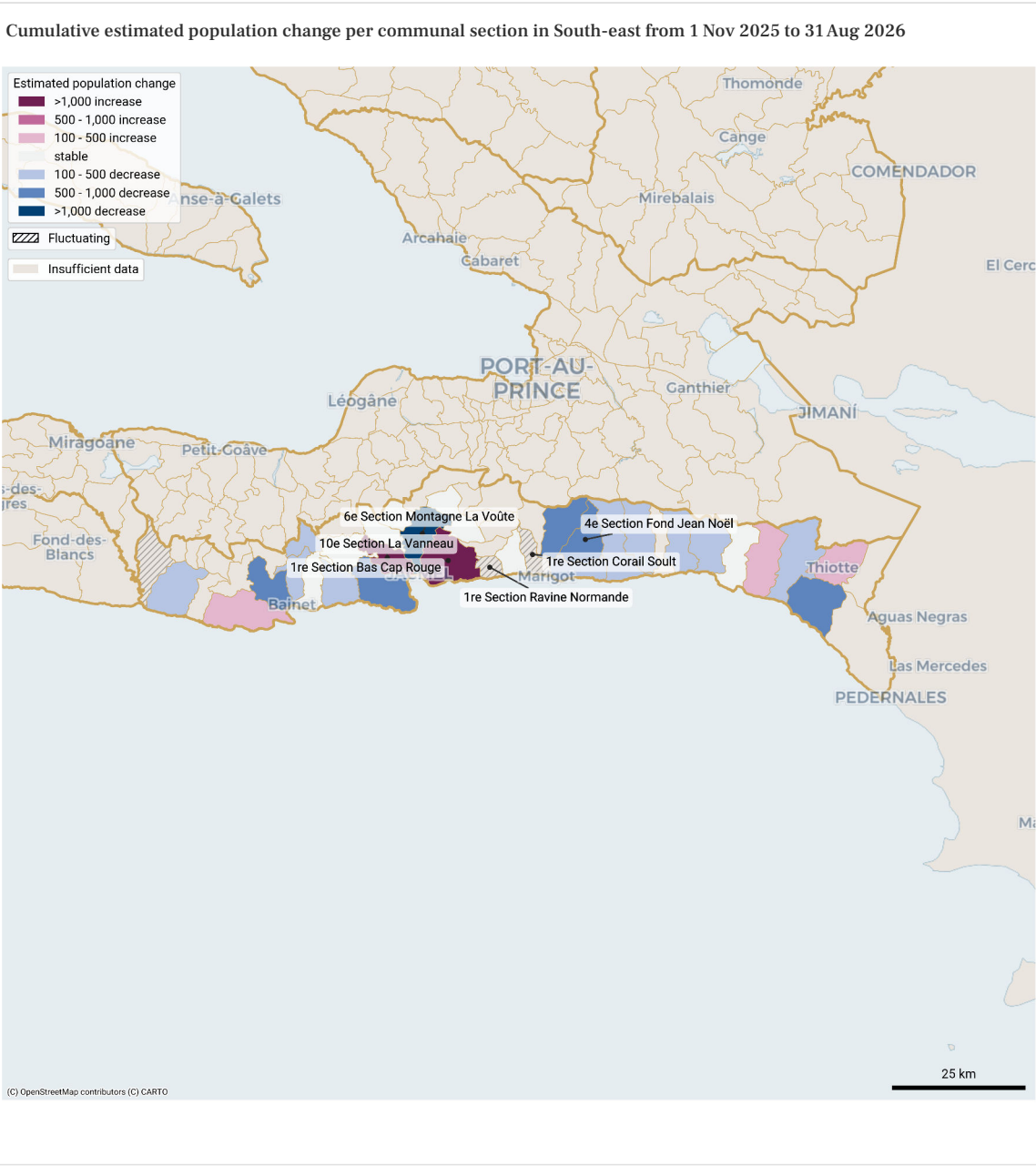
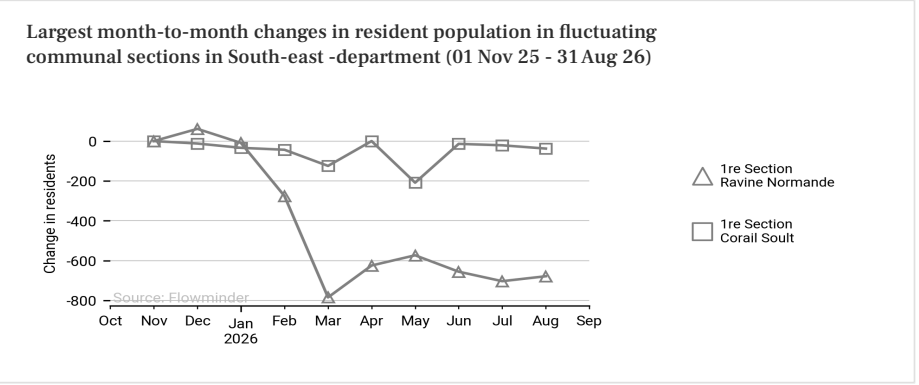
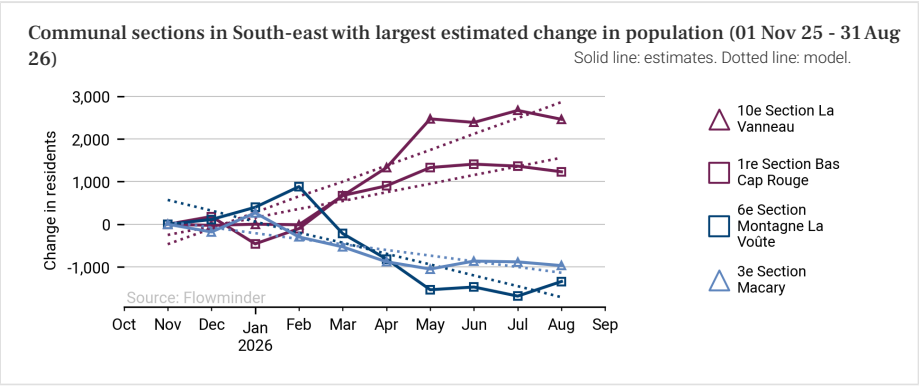
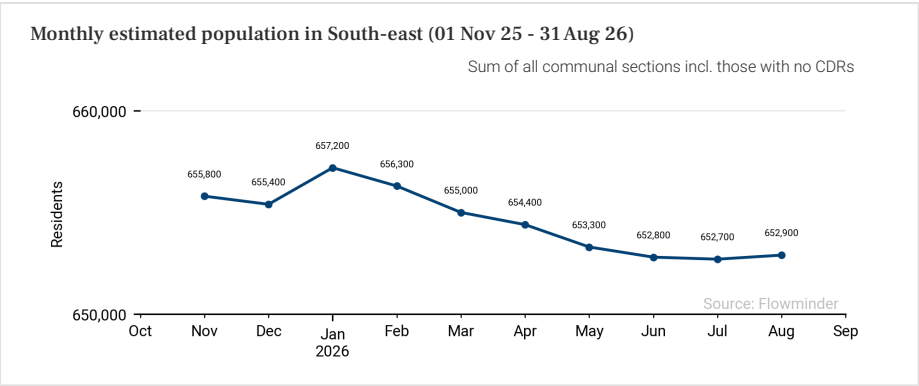
Largest month-to-month changes in resident population in fluctuating communal sections in South -department (01 Nov 25 - 31 Aug 26)



Cumulative estimated population change per communal section in South from 1 Nov 2025 to 31 Aug 2026



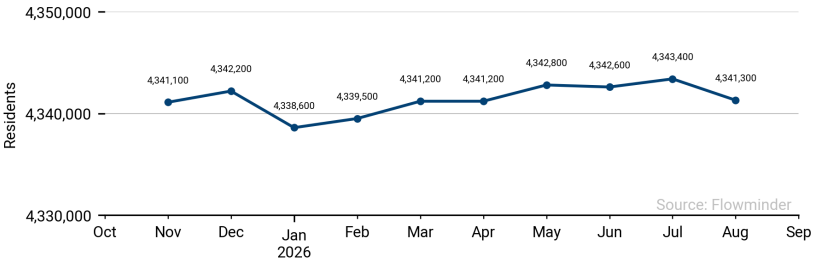
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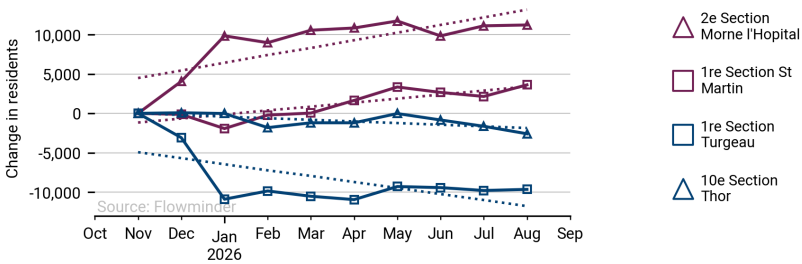
Monthly estimated population in West (01 Nov 25 - 31 Aug 26)

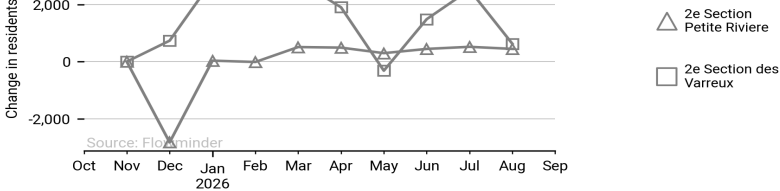


Communal sections in West with largest estimated change in population (01 Nov 25 - 31 Aug 26)

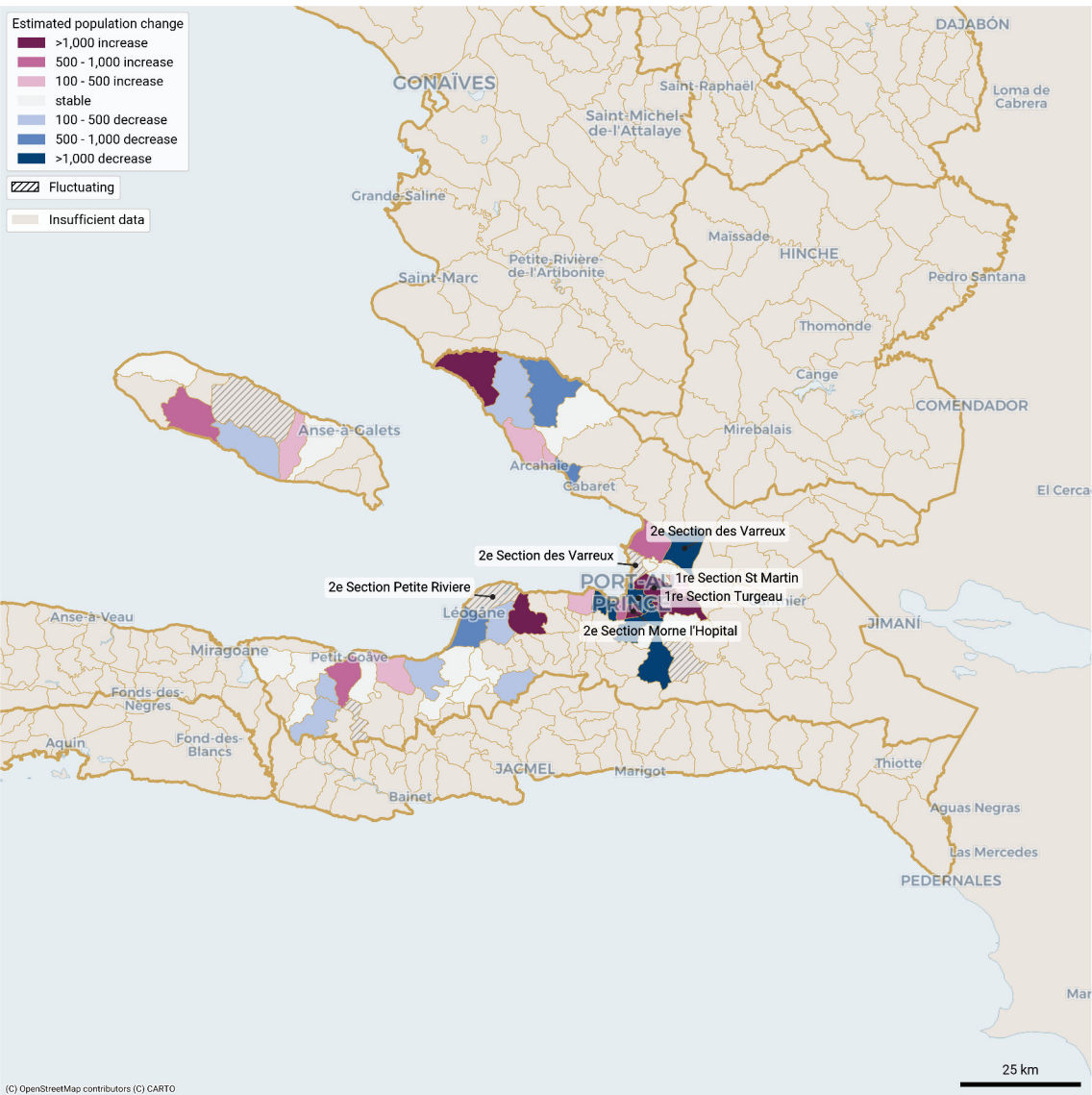

This study was made possible thanks to the anonymised (aggregated) Call Detail Records provided by a mobile network operator in Haiti.

How to use this report

We provide population estimates that take into account population movements within Haiti, per month and per communal section. We report the average decreasing/increasing trends for each communal section for which we have data. However, it is important to note that multiple trends can be observed over the reported 12-month period. The current crisis has led to large population movements, particularly of internally displaced people (e.g. [IDM round 5](#)), which can result in population statistics becoming outdated over a few months, and therefore impairing preparedness efforts (e.g. hazard population exposure estimation, needs assessment, service and contingency planning).

Indicators presented

Modelled change (trend): the predicted population change for the reporting period from all 12 monthly estimates, which smoothes out monthly variations (linear regression).

Estimated change: the difference in the estimated population between the first and last months of the 12 month reporting period, which does not reflect any monthly variation within.

For communal sections with fewer than 10 months of resident estimates during the reporting period, we do not make a trend classification (insufficient data). For monthly population estimates at the department level, we carry forward the latest estimate to fill missing months in a communal section so that the aggregated changes at the department level are only based on observed CDR-derived mobility.

For communal sections with fast changing populations, we categorised them as 'increasing', 'decreasing', 'stable', when there is little to no change, or as 'fluctuating' when large month-to-month changes prevented us from detecting a trend.

Report's data

This report uses our v4.0 dataset ([documentation](#), [release notes](#)), available at <https://haiti.mobility-dashboard.org>.

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Data privacy & governance

No personal data, such as an individual's identity, demographics, location, contacts or movements, is made available to the government or any other third party at any time. All results produced by Flowminder are aggregated results (for example, subscriber density in a given municipality), which means that they do not contain any information about individual subscribers.

This data is fully anonymised. This approach complies with the European Union's General Data Protection Regulation (EU GDPR2016/679). Data is processed on a server installed behind the mobile network operator's firewall in Haiti, and no personal data leaves the operator's premises.

Data considerations

The estimates shown are our best current assessment of movements. However, there are a number of uncertainties. The information should be interpreted together with other available evidence.
